Fire Safety Sessions

Oak, Sycamore and Hazel Classes had a very important Fire Safety Session with Karen Towner, Education Officer with Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service. The children were taught to Stop, Drop and Roll and also to Get Out and Stay Out!

They got to try on Fire Officer's uniforms and to see what equipment the Fire brigade use to fight fires.
